Ribbons are a part of all dogs shows, however the COGRC always gives out Rosettes. I didn't realize how special this was until I went to other shows. Other shows usually give a ribbon and the Rosettes are used for the bigger awards. So I thought I would research the beginning of the Rosettes. So here is a little trivia about the Rosettes found on the Hodges Badge Company, Inc.

Historians say the rosette award ribbon dates back as far as the 8th or 9th century.

Unlike the rosettes we know today, designed to resemble a rose, the first millennium rosettes are said to have been created to symbolize the moon and planets. In 1802, Napoleon Bonaparte instituted the use of the rosette award ribbons as part of the Legion of Honor award. These early rosettes, much larger than the rosettes we see today, were attached to the ribbon that displayed the Legion medal and presented to deserving individuals in recognition of outstanding military or civic service. Modern uses of rosettes are many. Award rosettes may be awarded to individuals or teams as a symbol of victory or excellence.

I am proud to have this tradition in the COGRC. Thank you to those before us whom decided this was the direction to go with the ribbons we award during our yearly Specialty. Shari
